(AECOM) to undertake a Preliminary Design and Class Environmental Assessment Study for Highway 403 and Highway 6 Interchange. The study limits extend from Grindstone Creek westerly to Old Guelph Road on Highway 403, and from Highway 6 and Highway 403 interchange to Bruce Trail on Highway 6. The Study encompasses fourteen bridges, three structural culverts, and fifteen retaining walls along Highway 403 and Highway 6. The Study Area is located within the City of Hamilton and the City of Burlington (Halton Region).
